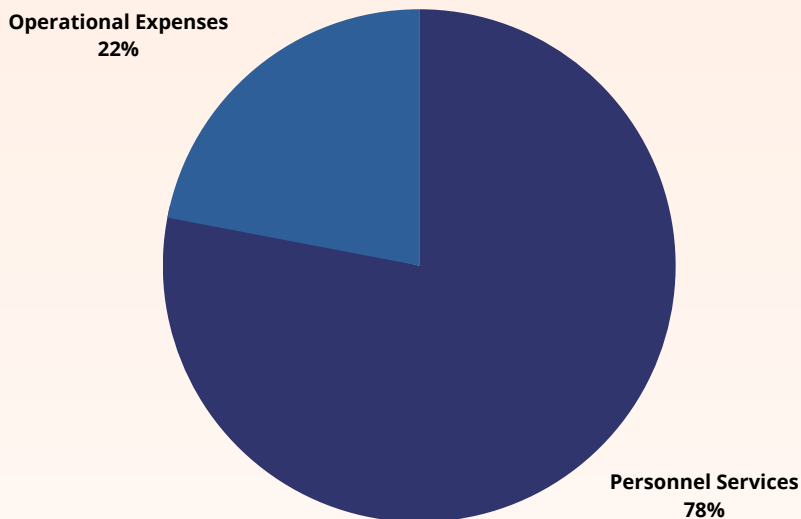
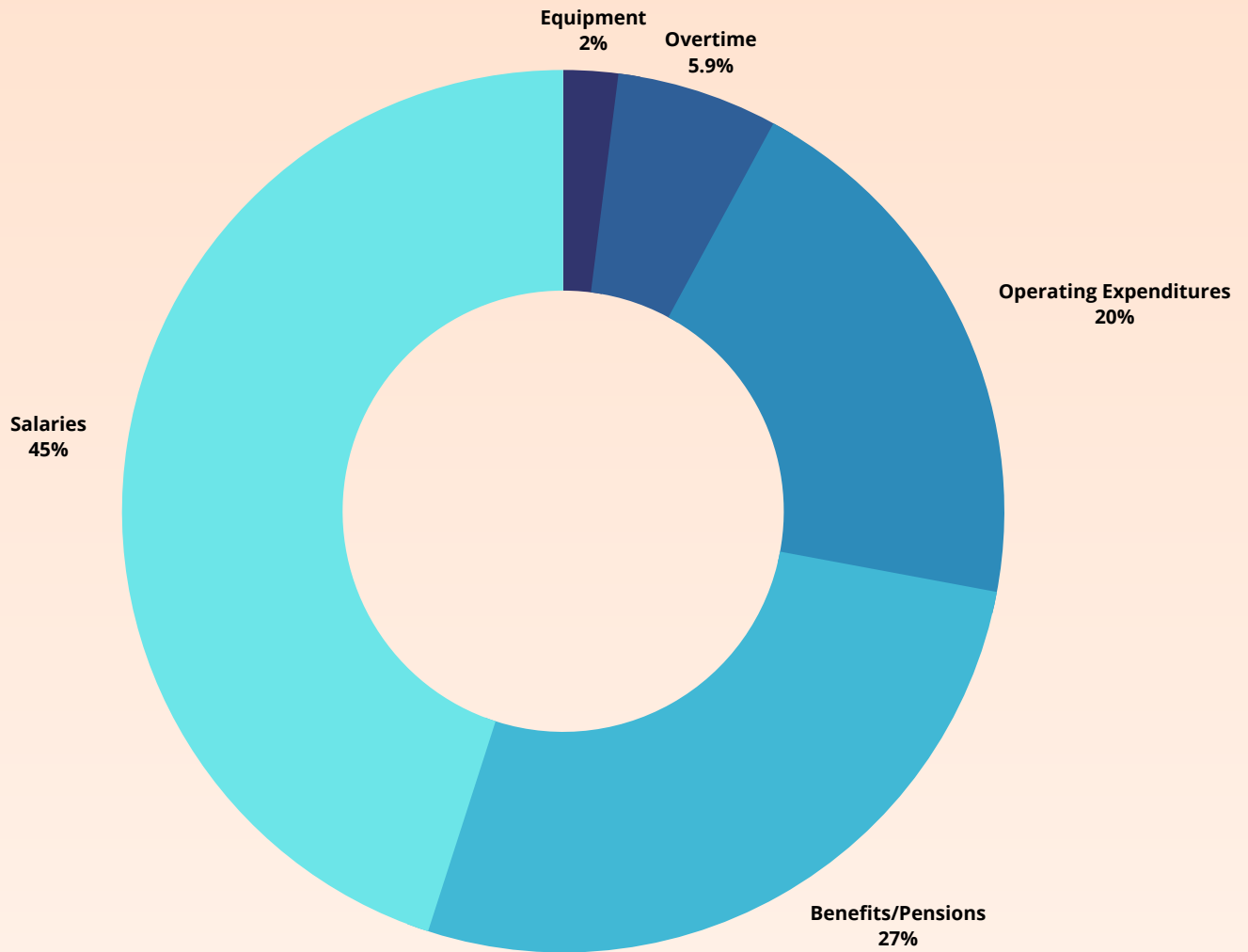

2022 GOALS

- Continued work on domestic violence reduction in partnership with the Mayor's Office of Domestic Violence and Human Trafficking along with the Family Peace Center.
- Further development of the Department's initiative in reducing mental health calls for service through the Community Co-Responder Team.
- Growth of partnerships with local, state, and federal law enforcement agencies to combat regional and national crime trends.
- Enhance traffic enforcement efforts to repel the dangerous increase in fatal and major motor vehicle related traffic crashes.
- Use motor vehicle traffic crash analytics to tailor enforcement strategies at high-risk locations.
- Review of juvenile crime trends and develop strategies that focus on the reduction of youth involvement.
- Complete the Implementation of a body worn camera program Department wide to better serve the citizenry and protect sworn personnel.
- Additional collaboration with public and private youth service providers.
- Continued investment in officer safety by offering the most up-to-date industry standard training available.
- Ensure all Department personnel have access to quality physical and mental health wellness options, based on current and future provider partnerships.



ADMINISTRATIVE BUREAU

The Administrative Bureau is comprised of Accreditation, Records, Chaplains, Research and Development, Information Technology, Payroll, Fiscal Services and the Volunteer Services. The Administrative Bureau is under the command of Assistant Deputy Chief Eddie Torrance.

Property and Evidence Division

The Property and Evidence Division is responsible for ensuring the integrity of evidence and property recovered by Rockford Police.

Fiscal Services Section

The Fiscal Services Section manages the Police Department's purchases, accounts payable and accounts receivable. The section also maintains an inventory of uniforms and police equipment, monitors the Department's equipment budget, researches the purchase of law enforcement equipment, prepares bid specifications and oversees contracts with vendors.

Records Center

The Records Center is responsible for providing timely and accurate information from the thousands of reports that the Rockford Police Department keeps on file. The Records Center Division also compiles statistics and reports them to the State of Illinois and FBI as outlined by the National Incident Based Reporting Standards (NIBRS).

Recruiting Section

The Recruiting Section is responsible for finding and attracting candidates for the position of sworn police officer for the department.

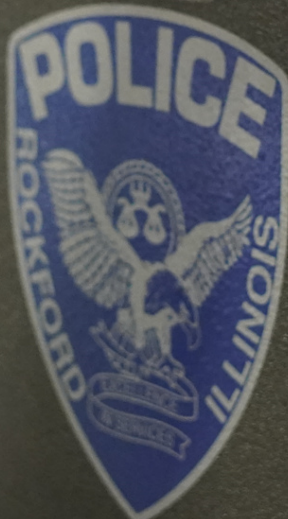
OPERATIONS BUREAU

The Rockford Police Department's Operations Bureau has vast responsibilities, encompassing several aspects of the work that keeps Rockford safe by enforcing the law while respecting the rights of citizens.

The Operations Bureau is comprised of three patrol districts: the Traffic Unit, K9 Unit, Community Services Unit and the Resident Officers (ROCK). Each district is under the command of the following:

- Assistant Deputy Chief Dave Lee, District 1, District 1
- Assistant Deputy Chief Randy Berke, District 2
- Assistant Deputy Chief Eddie Torrance, District 3





INVESTIGATIONS BUREAU

The Rockford Police Department Investigations Bureau is responsible for conducting follow up investigations on all criminal incidents. The bureau is under the command of Assistant Deputy Chief Ty Eagleson and is staffed by day and afternoon shifts, and on-call detectives. The Investigations Bureau is comprised of the following units: crime scene, domestic violence, financial and property crimes, gang, narcotics, property and evidence, sensitive crimes and violent crimes. The bureau is also staffed by patrol officers of the following units: Intelligence and the Specialized Community Oriented Policing Enforcement teams (SCOPE).

OFFICE OF PROFESSIONAL STANDARDS

The Rockford Police Department Office of Professional Standards (OPS) is under the overall command of Deputy Chief Reffett. The Office of Professional Standards consists of Internal Affairs and Administrative Review Processes.

K9 STATS

The Rockford Police Department has six full-time K9 Teams that operate both day and evening hours. They are commanded by an Administrative Lieutenant.

In 2022:

- 156 tracks completed this year in attempt to locate suspects of crimes.
- Apprehended 74 fleeing/hidden suspects.
- Performed 179 evidence searches and recovered 54 items.
- Was able to locate and take **36** firearms off of the streets.
- Conducted 46 public K-9 Demonstrations
- Attended bi-annual K9 Certification

ACHIEVEMENTS/ COMMUNITY SERVICE

Crisis Co-Response Team continues to have a positive impact on our citizens. Two Rosecrance mental health clinicians, two Rockford police detectives, a deputy with the Winnebago County Sheriff's Office, and a Loves Park Police Department officer make up a Crisis Co-response team. The goal of CCRT is to identify individuals struggling through a mental health crisis and get help before they enter the jail system.

Officers Seale and Turner continued to facilitate ROCK House Soccer over the Summer. This program meets every Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday, and allows area youth to sharpen their soccer skills, while having positive interactions law-enforcement, and learning life skills such as respect and healthy living. Officer Seale even started a futsal team and they traveled into the suburbs for matches.

Officer Turner continues "Fresh For Learning" at Five Alarm Laundromat on E. Riverside. RPS205 students and families can do their laundry for FREE every Wednesday evening, courtesy of Molina Healthcare.

RPD hosts numerous events and activities for the residents and families over at The Grove (across from District 3 on S. New Towne). From movie nights to after school reading to a Christmas party, we continue to engage with our neighbors!
